# **ATTENDANCE**

The link between good attendance and exam results has been well-established. A report by the Children's Commissioner shows that just 5% of children who had 50% attendance or less achieved grade 4 or above in five GCSEs. Only a third of students who had less than 90% attendance got five good GCSE passes this summer. This compared with 80% of students who had at least 95% attendance who achieved good grades. The report also found that students whose attendance improved in Year 11 did better that those whose absence did not improve. The Commissioner also highlighted that the impact was even greater on those pupils eligible for free school meals, or who had been identified as having special educational needs. All students should aim for 100% attendance whenever possible.






# NOTICE TO PARENTS/CARERS BUS PASSES

All students allocated to buses should all have a Durham County Council (DCC) issued bus pass except those Y10/11 students who are currently transported to and from the Gateway site. Students need to show their bus pass when boarding the bus on a morning and when boarding the bus for the journey home from school every day. If a student loses their pass, they need to apply for a new one at a cost of £5, which DCC charge, by contacting them on 03000264444 option 4. Once the pass has been ordered a temporary pass can be obtained from the school which can be used until the new pass arrives.

Please be aware that students may be refused travel if they fail to show their pass.



# **PARENT NOTICES**

#### **PARKING AT FERRYHILL**

Parents are not to park in the school car park or enter the site on foot to collect their child unless they have been provided with a permit from School. Due to ongoing works around the area, we have a designated exit to ensure students can leave the site safely.

# COLLECTION OF STUDENTS FROM FERRYHILL SITE

When collecting or dropping off a student during the school hours of 8:30am – 2:45pm, can we ask that parents/carers come to the new reception entrance based in room 10 which is signposted. The PE entrance used by students will be locked throughout the day and will not be manned by staff.

# COLLECTION OF STUDENTS FROM UPPER SCHOOL SITE

For parents picking up their child from the Upper School site, please do not park directly outside of the building as the school buses need space to park. By parking there it prevents students being able to board the buses safely. Please park on the opposite side to the Upper School building. Thank you for your support with this matter.
