Earnest Cook Trust supports outdoor learning for Ferryhill Students

On Friday 26 May, 7B3 and 7A2 went on a Geography visit to Hardwick Park with Miss Corner and Mrs Harris.

Each group looked at improving their map reading skills, contours, learning about ecosystems, wildlife and habitat along with a nature scavenger hunt... we spotted the cutest baby swans!! It was great to get outside the classroom and put some of our map skills into practice whilst enjoying the fresh air and nice weather.

Thanks to the Earnest Cook Trust this amazing day was able to take place and students were able to experience outdoor education and its benefits.

11 lucky students were picked to visit San Diego, which was funded by the Turning Scheme. The trip consisted of a visit to the Shivela Middle School in Murrieta, where the students spent a day in the life of a student in that school. They were given a T-Shirt to wear, a buddy for the day and attended all the lessons, breaks and lunches with the students. Our students behaved impeccably, they showed resilience and maturity and were a credit to the school. The head Mr Hamm, Mrs Hocking and all the staff were very welcoming and accommodating and gave Ms Lea and Mr Pinkney a tour of the school which was very interesting and informative.

On day two, the group visited San Diego Zoo, which is an international non-profit conservation organisation. They looked at all the different animal habitats and learned a lot about the eco systems. They came away with lots of fantastic facts and information about the zoo and it was an incredible day.

On day three, the group visited Balboa Park, which is an urban cultural park in San Diego, it is made up of natural vegetation zones, green belts, gardens, walking paths and contains around 17 museums in total. The students visited the Air and Space Museum, the Railroad Museum, The Natural History Museum, The Museum of Us and the Japanese Gardens. It was an amazing but busy day for the students.

On day four, the group visited Belmont Park which is an oceanfront historic amusement park located on Mission Beach, where they tried lots of new activities. They then travelled to Oceanside where they saw the famous Top Gun house and some spectacular views along the beach.

On the final day, the students visited the USS Midway Museum which is a historical naval aircraft carrier located at Navy Pier. The museum consists of the midway carrier and military jets amongst other things, there was lots to see and do!

Throughout the trip many people commented on how well behaved and polite the students were, both on the airplane and around the attractions. They truly were a credit to the school and we are so proud of them all. Well done team San Diego!

LUNCHTIME CORRECTION PROCEDURE

L1 and L2 corrections are issued by staff for out of classroom behaviour and are completed during the lunch period. Students will be reminded daily during tutor if they have a correction that day. If an L correction is not completed and the student has been in school, it will then be escalated to the next level e.g. L1 to L2/L2 to C4 etc.

L1 (15 minutes) – students are to attend the main hall at the start of their lunch period. Once the 15 minute correction has been completed, they can then go into the dining hall for their lunch.

L2 (30 minutes) – students are to attend the main hall at the start of their lunch period to register at their correction before being able to get their lunch to be eaten in the main hall.


LATE BUSES

Student Leaders Commissioners Challenge


A message from Glenys at Approach Too.


