### Parent Governor Vacancy

We currently have a vacancy for 1 Parent Governor on our Governing Body. The board is passionate about education and committed to continuous school improvement to ensure the best possible outcomes for our pupils.

To be a parent governor you should have:

- A strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children
- •Good inter-personal skills, curiosity, and a willingness to learn and develop new skills.

Our Governing Body has a membership of 12, with representatives from the staff, local community and parents.

The Governing Body is not involved in the day to day running of the school; they have a strategic role with responsibility for overseeing leadership and management. It has 3 core functions:

- setting strategic direction
- creating robust accountability
- ensuring best use of financial resources

The full Governing Body must meet at least three times per academic year, and as a school, we also have frequent Committee meetings each term. There is an expectation that governors will also undertake monitoring visits into school to find out more about the school throughout the year. Individual governors do not have any powers, instead the Governing Body works closely with the Executive Headteacher and Head of School to make decisions collectively as a team.

Any parent, or carer, of a registered pupil at the school at the time of election is eligible to stand for election as a Parent Governor (subject to certain exceptions, e.g. anyone employed at the school for more than 500 hours per annum is not eligible). Parent Governors, may on occasion, be elected by other parents at the school if there are more applications than spaces available.

Appointment is also subject to eligibility criteria and completion of a Disclosure & Barring Service check.

All governors must abide by our agreed Code of Conduct covering issues such as confidentiality, conflicts of interest, training requirements.

Prospective candidates are invited to speak with the Executive Headteacher and Chair of Governors prior to submitting an application so they are fully aware of the roles and responsibilities involved – please contact Mrs Forster, MAT Company Secretary, to make an appointment. Please note the closing date for this post is Friday 24 March 2023 at 12 noon.
