Stacey Wagstaff from the Girls' Network ran a workshop where the students had to identify their strengths but also identify areas of themselves that may need some development and what course of action needs to be taken to develop these areas. Overall, the day was a huge success where our students were given an insight into possible avenues for life after secondary school and how having a strong belief in yourself but also having a network of people who also believe in you can help you succeed.


ASPIRE DAY 3

Years 7 and 8 - students will take part in a mini Olympics event in school. Students can come to school wearing their PE kit.


Year 9 –students will be on a rotation covering sessions including forensics, science and engineering. Students are to arrive in school in full school uniform.

It's a day to celebrate, educate and inform... So many people haven't heard about chromosome disorders, yet it impacts a lot of people, our students, our family, and our friends.


Lucas Gough, one of our students here at Ferryhill School, shares his story: "In 2019, my family found out that my youngest brother had a duplicated 1Q 211.

LUNCHTIME CORRECTION PROCEDURE

Triple - 8 30 - 10 15

L1 and L2 corrections are issued by staff for out of classroom behaviour and are completed during the lunch period. Students will be reminded daily during tutor if they have a correction that day. If an L correction is not completed and the student has been in school, it will then be escalated to the next level e.g. L1 to L2/L2 to C4 etc.

L1 (15 minutes) – students are to attend the main hall at the start of their lunch period. Once the 15 minute correction has been completed, they can then go into the dining hall for their lunch.

L2 (30 minutes) – students are to attend the main hall at the start of their lunch period to register at their correction before being able to get their lunch to be eaten in the main hall.

LATE BUSES

School will no longer be providing late buses on a Tuesday and a Friday. Students will need to make their own arrangements to get home if they are staying back after the school day.

If students have any problems with these arrangements they will need to speak to their Learning Coordinator in the first instance.


