Supporting our local food banks

Nine Student Leaders from Years 9 &10 visited the Durham food bank in Chester-le-Street this morning. The warehouse collects, sorts and distributes items to 36 separate food banks throughout the county. In January, they fed around 4,000 people, which was a big increase on the month before, and they have seen the numbers of people asking for help exponentially rise in recent months. Our students helped sort through all of the donations, categorising them, and packing them by the expiry dates, ready to send out to local families. We're hoping to make this a monthly event.

VIETNAM 2023 *

A group of ten Year 10 students from Ferryhill School have just returned from our fantastic trip to Vietnam. The school managed to secure funding from the Turing Scheme to fully fund a free trip for our lucky pupils. Our packed itinerary included trips to various museums in Saigon, including the War Remnants museum, and the Cu Chi tunnels. We also visited a local school and made lots of new friends, followed by a sunset cruise on the river to see the city skyline. The acrobats from the world-famous "AO Show" wowed us at the Saigon Opera house. We sampled lots of local food, and one of the highlights was a boat trip along the fabulous Mekong Delta. One Year 10 student said "This was a great experience, and one of the best things I've ever done. It was an eye-opening experience, and has made me want to travel and see the world". We are busy planning for our other fantastic free trips to California, Dubai and San Diego.





This week we did a lot in STEAM club. Firstly, we checked on our salt crystal flowers from last week which had evaporated and we made them into flowers by adding pipe cleaner stems. Then, we did a twist on the classic 'baking soda volcano' and produced 'fizzing rocks' by mixing bicarbonate of soda (base) with water and freezing them. After half an hour, we squirted the rocks with vinegar/lemon juice (acid) which produced fizzing, a sign that a neutralisation chemical reaction had occurred. We also built towers with marshmallows and spaghetti to visit the more technological side of STEAM whilst we waited.

Parking/Exit Off Site After School



Chill Kids

For children aged 7-11 years old. Chill Kids helps your child to recognise their feelings and supports them to be calmer through exercise and relaxation. It helps them to build resilience and to be able to manage their emotions and self-regulate, in a group with other children their age. Sessions will include:

- Activities to learn communication skills
- Activities to reinforce positive behaviours
- Activities to promote relaxation and anger management techniques
 - Strategies to help to reduce negative behaviours.

Sessions last one hour and run weekly for 6 weeks.

Teen Zone

For young people aged 12-15 years. In the group there are activities to look at self-esteem, building resilience, healthy eating and managing emotions. This group will allow young people to understand changes in adolescence and how this may impact on their behaviours and emotions, whilst mixing and building social skills with other young people.

Sessions last one hour and run weekly over 6 weeks.

FEARless

For parents/carers of children aged 6-14 years. This course helps where you have a child who has anxiety which might be causing them to miss school or social events. This course helps you to understand your child's anxiety, recognise when your child is anxious and develop skills and techniques to help your child cope with their anxiety.

Sessions run for 2 hours a week over 6 weeks

Strengthening Families

For families with children aged 10-14 years. The Strengthening Families Programme will help you and your child prepare for their teenage years. You and your child will attend sessions together. Through discussions, fun games and other activities, you will solve problems together, learn about rules and consequences and explore ways to show love and support, strengthening family communication.

This is a weekly course carried out over 7 two-hour sessions
