
Afternoon Meeting follows a similar format across every year group at the end of the school day. This time will be used for Heads of Year to celebrate the successes of the day including:

HISTORY STUDENTS VISIT THE DISCOVERY MUSEUM







40 students went to the Discovery Museum on a trip to look at key historical events, this included some science inventions and old technologies. They were taken round the Turbinia Gallery where they found out some key information about the Turbinia ship. The World War II (Newcastle Story), where they looked at shelters, damage that had occurred and Fire Guards responsibilities. They also looked at the history of the Enigma machine used during World War2 and the ship that was instrumental in breaking the enigma code. They then travelled back in time to look at the North East Inventors and their inventions such as Joseph Swan, George and Robert Stevenson, William Armstrong and Charles Parsons. The students then discovered the science maze where there were lots of interactive and unusual science and technology gadgets for them to try which included the 1st battery Sinclair C5 assisted cycle. The students had a fantastic time and were a credit to the school.

TRIP OF A LIFETIME!

12 Ferryhill students from across years 9 and 10 travelled to Nakuru Kenya with Mrs Langdale for a volunteering experience of a lifetime.

Students have spent the last 18 months fundraising for this opportunity which allowed them to volunteer at The Walk Academy School that supports children from The Slums into education.

Students spent 5 days at The Walk Academy, carrying out a range of daily tasks and activities. These included:

Construction - helping moving rubble, making cement and plastering.

Catering - working in the school kitchen to provide over 500 children with the only meal they would get that day.

Teaching - before travelling students planned a lesson to teach to the children

Assistant- helping teachers and staff with any additional tasks, including marking tests or supporting in classroom.

After an incredible 5 days volunteering, students enjoyed a once in a life time experience on their 'day off'. The spent a morning on a sunrise safari through Nakuru National Park, where they saw giraffes, zebras, buffalos and a beautiful lioness.

This was followed by an afternoon visit to the Equator where they crossed between the Northern and Southern hemispheres and participated in a scientific experiment of gravitational force.

It has been an incredible 10 days for all those involved and staff and students would like to thank all those in the community who supported this amazing project!

GOLDSMITH AWARD FINALS!!

Six of our Student Leaders recently travelled to London to take part in the final of the prestigious Goldsmiths' Awards. This recognises schools that have worked hard to improve their local communities. Having sailed through the preliminary rounds, and the regional final, Ferryhill School was one of eight finalists. We began our adventure with a tour of London and watching Grease, the musical, in the West End. After a good night's sleep in the hotel, we made our way to Goldsmiths' Hall, where in medieval times gold was valued and stamped with a "hallmark" named after the hall itself. Here we listened to the other schools give their presentations, and then it was our turn to speak. All six students spoke extremely well about the huge amount of work we have done to help, including working with the police on crime and antisocial behaviour, raising money for charity, and helping at foodbanks and charities. The judges' verdict was that Ferryhill School came a very close second, and won a prize of £1,000 to spend on helping our local community. This is a huge achievement for our school, considering that over 200 schools nationally applied for the award, and we are looking forward to continuing to help out in the new term. BUS PASS APPLICATIONS 2023/24

Bus applications for 23/24 are now live on DCC's website. Please note that all existing students who are entitled to either free or concessionary (pay for their bus pass) travel will have their place rolled over again for next year so you don't need to apply. However, the charges for concessionary bus passes will increase for 23/24 and these costs will not be known until nearer the end of term.

Only new applications from the 23/24 Y7 September intake need to apply for either entitled (free) or concessionary bus passes. The concessionary bus passes apply to the areas of Ferryhill Station, Chilton and all of Spennymoor (from Croxdale up to Middlestone Moor). In order to guarantee a place on these buses please apply asap even though the costs are still unknown at this stage for concessionary travel as you can always reject your place once it has been allocated to you if you change your mind in the future.

REQUEST FOR OLD/OUTGROWN UNIFORM






