# Striving for Excellence

### **Updates to Ferryhill School Behaviour for Learning Policy**

At Ferryhill School our core values of integrity, creativity and excellence underpin everything we do. For us, positive behaviour and attitudes towards learning are paramount when considering excellence. In order to ensure all students have the opportunity to excel, we have reviewed our current behaviour policy. A brief summary of any updates is included below and we would like to make parents/carers/guardians aware that the policy can be read in full on the school website.

#### **OUT OF LESSON BEHAVIOUR**

Students of Ferryhill School are expected to act calmly and sensibly, both in and out of lessons. Out of lesson behaviours that do not support this ethos will be met with a lunch time detention in the main hall. This will follow the L1, L2 and L3 system for managing out of lesson behaviour. L1 consists of a 15-minute detention and an L2 is a full half an hour lunch detention. Students will be provided with lunch and have the opportunity to visit the toilet during such detentions. Students who continue to repeatedly cause issues out of lesson time will have longer and gradually increasing periods of time allocated in the lunch detention room as set by their Learning Coordinator.

#### LATENESS TO LESSONS

The majority of our students are on time for lessons at Ferryhill School. They line up outside of classrooms quietly and sensibly. Moving forward, students should arrive to lessons promptly, ready to learn within 3 minutes of leaving their previous class. Students who are late by more than 10 minutes on a single occasion will receive a C4 detention. If a student reaches a total of 15 minutes late during a half term, they will also receive a C4, which will repeat for every incident of lateness thereafter. There will be occasions where students are late as staff may need to speak with them and we ask that students request a note in their planner on such occasions.

We would like to thank all of our students who display excellent behaviour and attitudes to learning on a daily basis. Those students are truly a credit to the school. We want all students to maximise their potential so they can become the very best versions of themselves. This starts with a strong work ethic and a desire to learn. Positive habits lead to excellence and this is something we strive for every day. It is important to note that the continued support of parents/carers/guardians is an integral part of developing positive learning habits and helping each student reach an individual level of excellence. As always, we thank you for everything you do in support of Ferryhill school.

#### **IEWELLERY AND PIERCINGS**

No jewellery or piercings of any type are allowed to be worn by students whilst at Ferryhill School. Any students who wish to get their ears pierced should do so at the start of the 6 weeks holidays. This allows time to heal and for the piercing to be removable before returning to school. Jewellery of any kind is also not part of our school uniform and is consequently not allowed to be worn for school. Following confiscation, the sanctions for wearing jewellery and piercings are as below:

1st Incident - Item to be collected by parents, after 2:40pm


2nd Incident - Item to be collected by parents, after 2:40pm and a C4 detention 3rd Incident - Item to be collected by parents, after 2:40pm and a 1-day isolation

4th Incident - Item to be collected by parents, after 2:40pm and a 2-day external isolation

### MOBILEPHONES / SMART WATCHES / MUSIC PLAYERS / GADGETS

Mobile phones must be switched off, not just on silent and completely out of sight at all times so that students can focus fully on their learning. This is also the case when exiting the school building at the end of the school day, including period 6 (Year 11). Smart watches are also not to be worn, but a standard analogue or digital watch is perfectly acceptable for use. Any other gadgets of any description are also not allowed. Confiscated items will be dealt with using the same system as previously mentioned for jewellery. In addition, students who persistently break the rules on electronic devices, will be asked to hand items to student reception before they are allowed entry into school. Again, the majority of our students already demonstrate high levels of integrity by consistently following these rules.

# Ferryhill School Football




