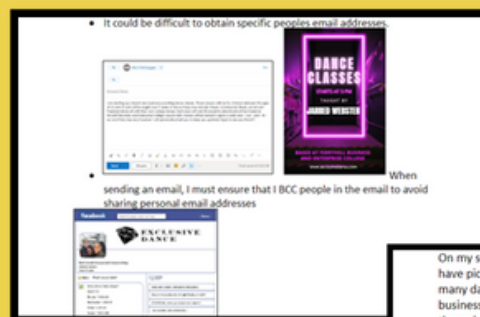


## Outstanding Work in Business!

The Year 10 Students have been completing Component 2 Coursework and have produced extensive research in to their chosen local enterprise. Some examples of their work can be seen here.....

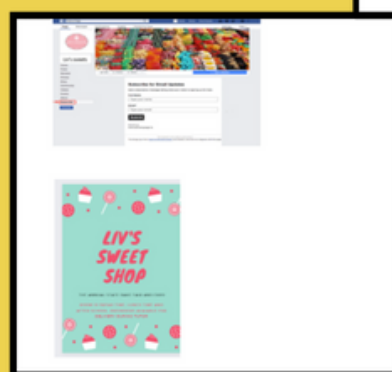

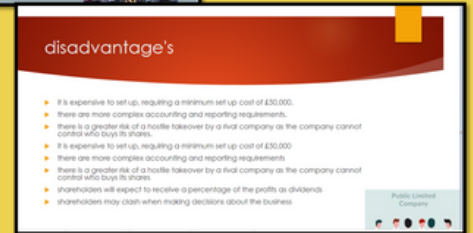
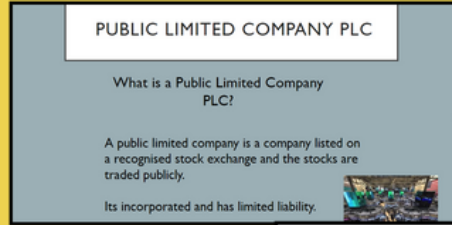

Excellent work by 9C1, not only creating presentations on limited companies but also standing in front of the class to present them – All did an amazing job.

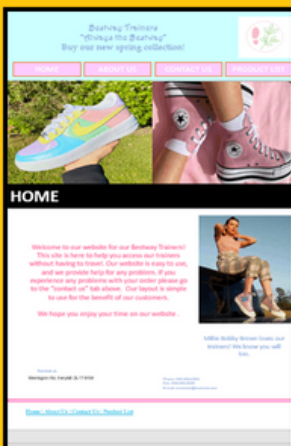
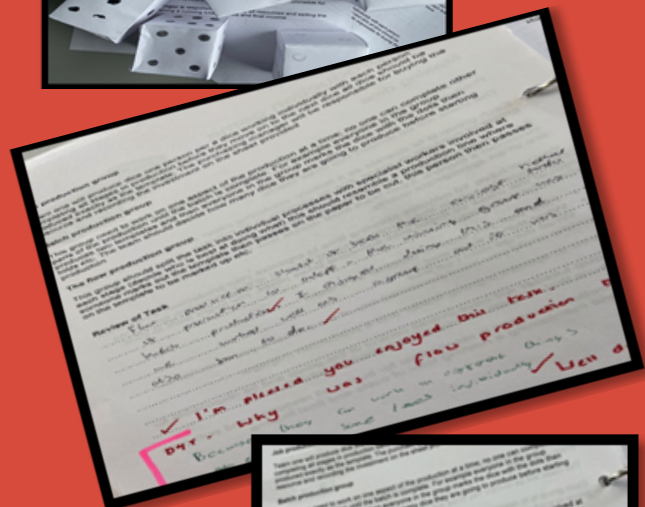


Year 9 have been completing work on different functional areas of a business. They have designed excellent websites for their Trendy Trainers Project.

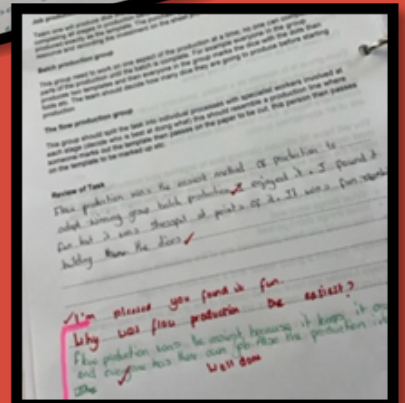
Year 9 have also been replicating the different methods of production a business can use by making dice and selling the high quality dice back

# Outward Bound - Ullswater 2022

48 Ferryhill School students travelled to the Lake District to spend the week taking part in a range of outdoor adventurous activities in and around the beautiful setting of Ullswater lake.

As soon as we arrived, students took part in the 'jog and dip' activity - running a short distance then jumping off the jetty into the lake. This was just the beginning of the students pushing themselves out of their comfort zones.

All activities throughout the week have tested and challenged the students in different ways, such as facing fears of heights and small spaces. Students have taken part in climbing and abseiling down rock faces, Ghyll scrambling through the streams of Ullswater, mountain walking to the summit of Place Fell, descending and canoeing back across the lake, orienteering, tunnelling, and cliff jumping into the lake.
